Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters. What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. (I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power.

For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and made his home in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, so that what had been spoken through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled:

“Land of Zebulun, land of Naphtali,
on the road by the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles—
the people who sat in darkness
have seen a great light,

light has dawned.”

From that time Jesus began to proclaim, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.”

And he said to them, “Follow me, and I will make you fish for people.” Immediately they left their nets and followed him. Immediately they left the boat and their father, and followed him.

Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.

The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:



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From the Calendar of Saints

January 25 Conversion of Saint Paul the Apostle

Saul, an orthodox Jew who zealously persecuted Christians, became Paul, the apostle of Jesus to the Gentiles. He experienced a dramatic conversion on the road to Damascus when Christ spoke to him from heaven.

January 26 Timothy and Titus *Companions of Saint Paul*

Timothy, son of a Greek father and a Jewish mother who was a convert to Christianity, was sent by Paul on important missions to the Thessalonians, the Corinthians, and the Ephesians. Another young man, Titus, a Greek, accompanied Paul to the apostolic council at Jerusalem, and later ministered in Corinth and Crete.

January 27 John Chrysostom *Bishop of Constantinople, 407*

One of the great saints of the Eastern Church, John was called Chrysostom, “the golden- mouthed,” because of his great eloquence as a preacher. His sermons give insights into the liturgy of the church, especially eucharistic practices.

January 28 Thomas Aquinas *Priest and Friar, 1274*

Next to Augustine, Aquinas is considered the greatest theologian in the history of the church. After Aristotle’s works were rediscovered, Aquinas asserted in his *Summa Theologica* the basic harmony of reason and revelation.
